4. Bread from Heaven – How much is enough?
5. Water from the Rock – The Israeli and Palestinian historical context explained.
6. Ten Commandments – Be an advert for God
7. The Golden Calf – Rob – Rediscovering Faith when surrounded by a crowd of doubt.
8. Moses Intercession – I'm not going, unless you go with me God.
